
If you had the ability to prevent a tragedy, wouldn't you?

- Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is a leading cause of death under 25, and the #1 killer of student athletes
- Nearly 1 in 100 kids has an undetected heart condition
- American Heart Association cites nearly 10,000 youth affected annually
- Sudden Cardiac Arrest Foundation calls SCA a public health crisis with a dangerously low awareness
- American Board of Family Medicine study noted that 72% of students who suffered from SCA had at least one symptom before the event—they just didn't recognize it as life threatening
- 2014 IOC World Conference of Prevention of Injury & Illness in Sport cites SCA rates in U.S. high schools as significantly greater than previously reported, noting the media misses at least 50% of cases
- In Italy, they check every student athlete's heart and have reduced sudden cardiac death by 89%
- At least 15% of CIF high schools are aware of an SCA event having occurred in their student community – that's hundreds of students lost to a syndrome that could be prevented
- 2015 National Center for Catastrophic Sport Injury Research cites that more athletes die from sudden cardiac arrest than from sport-related trauma

A female student at Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks has died after collapsing during basketball practice on Monday, according to school officials.



Nikki Valdez, a freshman, was at the team's practice in the afternoon when she suddenly collapsed, the school's president, Brett Lowart, said in a statement.

The team was doing a "track run" when Valdez fell to the ground, a teammate said.







Elements of the Act

 Coaches participate in bi-annual SCA training via free, 10-minute online video at NFHS, which also has a pre-test, post-test and score reporting tool that is useful to administrators

Elements of the Act

- Coaches empowered to remove from practice/play a student athlete exhibiting SCA symptoms
- A student-athlete who has been removed from play after displaying signs or symptoms associated with SCA may not return to play until he or she is evaluated and cleared by a licensed health care provider.
- While some may perceive it as an inconvenience for an athlete to miss a game while waiting to be cleared, it would be a tragedy to miss a warning sign that was a precursor to that student's death.
